

Eureka-Arcata Route 101 Corridor Improvement

FACT SHEET

The Project

Since May 2002, a Safety Corridor has been in place on Route 101 between Eureka and Arcata as an interim improvement until a more permanent solution could be designed and constructed. In December 2011, a phased plan received approval by the Humboldt County Association of Governments (HCAOG), the project sponsor. The first phase of improvements includes a half-signal at Airport Road and a northbound grade separation at Indianola Road. All other median openings including Mid City Motors, California Redwood, Bracut, and Bayside Cutoff will be closed.

Project Benefit

The safety of the traveling public is of the highest priority and improved safety at intersections, reducing collisions, will be a project benefit.

Project Status

The project received Federal Consistency from the California Coastal Commission in September 2013. Environmental document is targeted to be completed in February of 2015.

Project Costs

The first phase total project cost is approximately \$26 million.
